

## TOWN MEETING NEWS

**TOWN MEETING** will be held on **Saturday, February 27<sup>th</sup>** at 9:00 a.m. at the **Robinson Elementary School**. The Town and Robinson School budgets, plus other Articles included on the Warning, are discussed and voted on here. You must be in attendance to vote on these Articles. This year a specific time of 11:00 am will be set for the School District Meeting.

**AUSTRALIAN BALLOT VOTING** will be held on **March 1, 2016** at the Robinson Elementary School. Polls are open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm. We vote on the Hannaford Career Center budget, Town and School District Officers, and the Mt. Abe budget on this day. There will also be a ballot for the **Presidential Primary** as well. Voters may also vote by Absentee Ballot if they are not able to get to the polls.

**ABSENTEE BALLOT VOTING:** Voters who wish to vote absentee can request a ballot up until February 29<sup>th</sup>. Ballots can be mailed, picked up at the office, or the voter can vote right at the office. Also, for those voters who are in need of assistance, a couple of Justices can bring the ballots to your home and assist you.

**FILING HOMESTEAD DECLARATION HS 122:** The State of Vermont web site is currently unavailable for filing your Homestead Declaration HS 122 online. From the message it seems that the new programming will be in place in February some time. The deadline for filing your Homestead is still April 15. If you file for an extension on your Federal Income Tax remember, there is no extension on the Homestead Declaration. The penalty from the State is very high, so please do not make this mistake. If you have NO INCOME you still need to file your homestead declaration and the HS 144 income statement for the State. Please call Celine 453-2639 if you have any questions, or need help filing your paperwork.

**RABIES CLINIC:** March 19, 2016 – Starksboro Town Office – 9:00 am to 11:00 am. \$15 per animal – Dogs & Cats welcome – Bring most current rabies certificate for a 3 year expiration date, otherwise it will be only good for 1 year. Dr. Randy Ross, Vet.



**DOG LICENSES:** Due on or before April 1<sup>st</sup>. A valid rabies certificate is required. Fees are \$9 for spayed or neutered, \$13 for unspayed / unneutered. Dogs have to be licensed with the town every year.

**HUNTER SAFETY CLASS:** The office gets lots of calls from folks looking for a Hunter Safety Class. The Bristol Rec Department sponsors one each year. This year the dates are 4/4, 6, 9, 11 & 13. ## Subscribe to a Full Season of Fresh Vegetables

### How it works:

#### Sign up and pay

In the spring, you sign up and pay for a full season of fresh vegetables. The sooner you sign up and pay in full, the less it costs. See Sign Up Form (other side) for prices.

#### Weekly vegetable pickup

Each week, starting the week of June 15th, through the week of October 26th (20 weeks), you get a share of the harvest. We will provide you with a selection from the over 50 varieties of vegetables that we grow. Pickup days & times vary by pickup site. See below.

#### Two Share sizes

To accommodate different household sizes and eating preferences, we offer two share sizes.

**The Standard Share** is suitable for a family of four eating a serving of vegetables every night.

**The Small Share** is suitable for a couple eating a serving of vegetables every night.

These are only rough guides. For example: we have plenty of couples who are very happy with the standard share.

We charge an additional \$50 for off-farm pickup sites, to cover our cost of trucking the shares to the sites. However, \$2.50 per pickup is less than it would cost you to drive to the farm. Even with this added cost, you'll find it is still one of the best CSA values around.



### Farm Share Agreement


