- 4. Town Plan Energy
 - a. Address Question from the Planning Commission
 - b. Review Megan's draft letter
 - i. Will draft letter for review
 - ii. Three parts to her letter
 - 1. Reminding the benefits of Substantial Deference
 - a. Remind them of what this is and why it protects the interest of the Town
 - b. It's not a liability or commitment to the town, but an opportunity for a voice at the table
 - 2. Responding to their questions with references to the Town Energy Plan
 - 3. Respond with information to last three bullets
 - a. We have information in data from GMP from Starksboro bills
 - b. 2020 is 10 years out as basis for letter
 - Jeff will confirm when the date we lose the \$.06/kWh adder and that we lose the service charge (meter reading fee) offset we would have to pay
 - d. Robyn sent out current data
 - e. Jeff will ask AllEarth about solar degradation over time
- 5. Benchmarking Town Buildings Project Update
 - a. Robyn has entered benchmarking data:
 - i. GMP
 - 1. 2020-2021
 - 2. Historical data missing from 2019

- 3. Robyn will update back information
- 4. Street lights and the Rec Field aren't included
- 5. Can't apply solar credits to the street lights
- ii. Fuel use
 - 1. Robyn will finish inputting fuel oil and propane for all buildings
- iii. Solar data
 - 1. Need to input
 - 2. Could create a new account for just the solar to keep track of all solar in one bucket
 - 3. GMP data is kWh generated and returned, which are the same for this data set
- b. Once all is in, we would then have all energy information for the Town
 - i. Can run one report with street lights and one without
- 6. Solar PV
 - a. GMP 10 year solar adder term is ending
 - b. Determine what to recommend to Select Board
 - i. Jerusalem School House committee discussed solar on that roof
 - c. The recent proposed AllEarth proposal was on school land and not town land so the Select Board decided not to move forward since it's not their land
 - d. Jeff may follow up on AllEarth repowering trackers to better understand data results and potential impacts
- 7. Update on Paul's Electricity Reporting Tool
 - a. It's a data logger that takes information directly from GMP
 - b. This is interesting and could be useful
 - c. If AllEarth is presumably watching this now
 - i. The Town should be looking at the AllEarth web site
 - d. We should let this go for now
- 8. Button Up Campaign/Workshop Update
 - a. 2021/2022 planning is under way
 - b. Robyn will let organizer know Starksboro is interested
 - c. More details in the upcoming months
 - d. Window Dressers is taking hold in communities
 - i. Maine non-profit provides materials
 - ii. EVT will do some testing on performance and may lead to some savings
- 9. Food Shelf/New Communities Project outreach and coordination
 - a. EVT launched some low-income programming, under development
 - b. Should be getting closer to an answer
- 10. Starksboro Residents' House Weatherization Projects
 - a. Richard to drop off CVOEO brochures at Town Clerk's Office
 - b. Customer was pleased with WAP program
 - i. Ask customer if he would be willing to do a testimonial
 - c. Huntington did a weatherization 101 event
 - d. Robin would be interested in brainstorming on future events and making local connections

- e. Think about trying to clear out basements or attics to coordinate both events as an incentive
